He also works as a Senior Research Consultant at Melian Dialogue Research Limited, United Kingdom. He holds a Ph.D. in Management Science and Engineering from Jiangsu University and a Master's Degree in Computer Science and Technology from Jiangsu University of Science and Technology, both in Zhenjiang, China. Dr. Larnyo is a recipient of the Level-One Jiangsu Provincial Government Scholarship for Outstanding Achievements in Scientific Research, 2020, and several other academic and research laurels. He does interdisciplinary research in digital & eHealth, health informatics, epidemiology, big data & machine learning, technological innovation management, technology adoption, and optimization at the intersection of healthcare, public sector administration, and computer science. What do you enjoy most about being a PostDoc?

"I have truly enjoyed meeting, thinking, and being in community with the people that make up the Center for Black Studies Research as well as the Black Studies department. Dr. Tettegah and Dr. Battiste are both kind, experienced, and very knowledgeable, and I benefit greatly from simply having access to them both.
