Political Economy of Racial Inequality in "Colorblind" Republican France

Center for Black Studies Research 4603 South Hall France has relatively low levels of income inequality. Yet due to the strength of its "colorblind" ideology, race is not accounted for in data measuring inequality and poverty.

In this talk, Dr. Montague evaluates
the impact of labor market
segmentation, dualism in the labor
market, inequalities produced by the
structure of the French welfare state,
and data on poverty. She argues that
there is evidence that France has high
levels of intergroup inequality and
persistent poverty disproportionately
impacting Blacks.

If so, "colorblind" political and economic policies may be institutionalizing bias, ultimately sustaining racial inequality.
