Dr. Monica McLemore is a tenured professor in the Child, Family, and Population Health Department and Interim Director for the Center for Anti-Racism in Nursing at the University of Washington School of Nursing. Her peer reviewed articles, OpEds and commentaries have been cited in five amicus briefs to the Supreme Court of the United States and three NASEM reports.
