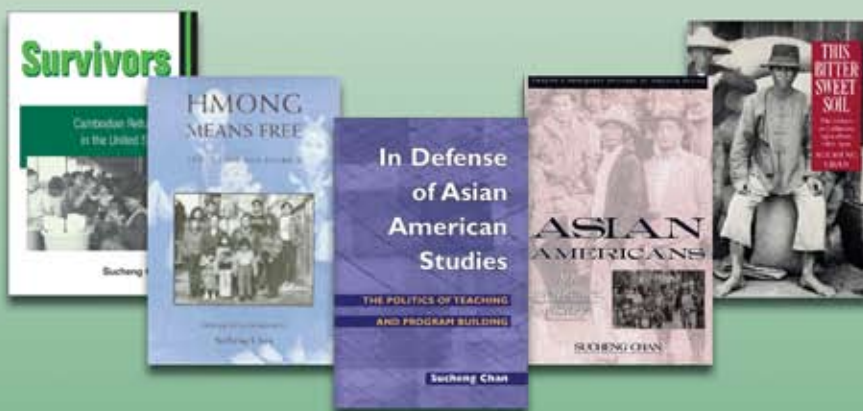

As Sucheng Chan prepares to leave Santa Barbara after 25 years, she reflects on her 45 years in the field of Asian American Studies.

Chan is a pioneering Asian American Studies scholar who has written or edited 18 books on Asian American history. While many Asian American Studies programs had been established since the late 1960s, she established at UCSB the first department of Asian American Studies in the nation at a major research university.



Sucheng Chan's talk is part of the Colloquium Series of the Department of Asian American Studies, as well as the "Thinking Along With..." discussion series hosted by the Center for Black Studies Research.
